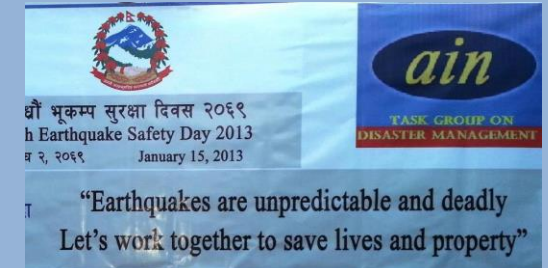
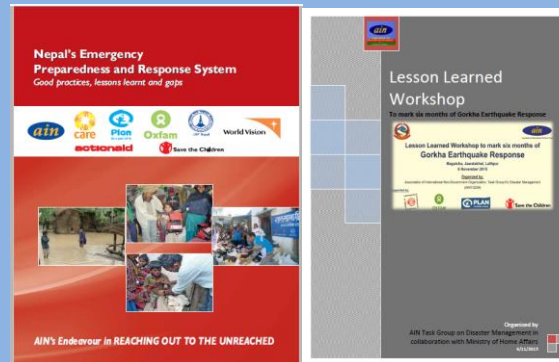
Task Group for Disaster Management and Climate Change (TGMCC)
