Indicative information

Background

Many people will, at some point in their lives, find themselves in the role of a counsellor without having a true understanding of the concept of counselling or what the role of the professional counsellor entails.

There is a big difference between a professional counsellor and a person who uses some counselling skills as part of their role. A professional counsellor is a highly trained individual who can use a different range of counselling approaches with their clients. Whereas a person who use some basic counselling skills are aware and use some basic techniques to listen and help people to vent out.

In today's time there are multiple stress factor and not knowing how to cope and handle them might lead to mental health problem. Mental health issues are still stigmatized and people living with it are discriminated and excluded from the society. With this existing reality of our society seeking help for your mental wellness has always been a challenge. There are very little places and very few people with whom and where we can go and vent our bottled emotions and feelings.



Moreover, we have very few trained people with basic psychosocial counselling skill and assures that they will listen without non-judging.

PLHIV and Key population have many diverse issues and challenges that they face in everyday life. Stigma and discrimination, side effects of medicine and depression, anxiety, self-doubt etc are faced every day. Not being able to deal with or cope in a correct manner may lead to adverse impact in their life. People working with PLHIV and KP directly or indirectly may face many situations where they must listen to people venting and sharing their feeling. They may not be a trained counsellor but if they have the skills of basic psychosocial counselling, they can provide the right support at the right time to the PLHIV and KPs.

Therefore, the purpose of this consultancy is to create awareness and provide a conceptual clarity on basic psychosocial counselling and enhance basic psychosocial counselling skills of people working and dealing directly or indirectly with PLHIV and KPs, so that they are equipped with basic psychosocial counselling skill to deal with many different situations they face during and while providing services.

Award criteria

- Working experience on promoting healthy psychosocial environment.
- Excellent report writing and facilitation skills in both English and Nepali.
